That was the annulment of William Beck proved in court by the oath of Willis Whiffle and James Wright two of the subscribing witnesses thereto And at the same time Alfred Beck and Thomas Wright Esqs named in said will came before the Court and qualified as Esqs according to law and order that this issue accordingly List Wm Becken C. C. In the name of God amen I William Beck Sr of Duplin County of North Carolina declare that it is allotted for all men to die so therefore deem it prudent at this time being possessed of a sound and disposing mind and memory blessed be God for the same to express & direct in what manner my temporal estate shall be disposed of after my decease it is therefore my will and desire that the same be in the manner and form following that is to say First I give devise & bequeath to my loving wife Sarah Beck all that part and portion of plantation whereon I now live which is situated lying and being on the South side of the Cape Fear River including my dwelling house and all the improvements belonging to the same and also all the improvements and lying to the South and West of the same plantation and dwelling house which is included in in the said plantation tract to have and to hold the same together with all the improvements appurtenances & appurtenances thereof unto her and during her natural life & then I give and bequeath to my said wife the negro following negro slaves to wit Lewis Moses Abby Louanna bread Agabala and her child Edna also two head of horses say the young bay mare and young sorrel mare from Aris and their calves Two head of sheep four sows & their pigs such as she may choose also one yoke of oxen and one cart my riding chair and harness two feather beds and furniture and so much of my house hold and kitchen furniture and family utensils as shall be deemed necessary by my Exrs here in the named for her use and convenience in keeping house and

carrying on the necessary business of said plantation to have to hold the same
 and every part thereof for and during the time of natural life. It is
 further my desire that my Eys herein after named as soon as may
 be after ^{her} ~~my~~ disease shall sick and lay off so much of my crop
 of corn and other provisions for the use and benefit of my said wife
 as may be necessary for the support for and during the term of one
 year after my decease. I give devise and bequeath to my son Alfred
 Beck the whole of my land and real estate situate by my and
 being in the County of Duplin & Sampson except the line estate of my
 wife herein already carried out of my said real estate also two lots
 lying in the town of Lorton in Sampson County to have and to
 hold to him and his heirs for ever & likewise I give and bequeath
 to my said son Alfred Beck my desk and book case to him
 and his heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth
 Wright in addition to those already given to her one negro girl
 slave name Louisa to her and her heirs for ever in addition.
 I give and bequeath to my daughter Charlotte Borden in addition
 to those already given one negro boy slave name Hampton to her
 & her heirs forever it is my will and desire that my Eys shall
 as soon as practicable after decease sell the whole of the residue of my
 estate except my negro slaves at a credit of six months and out
 of the product of such sale and such debts as may be due &
 owing to me pay off all my just debts as soon as the same can be done
 convenient and further it is my will and desire that my Eys shall
 immediately after my decease divide and sell all my negro slaves
 which are not already bequeathed into five lots of equal value &
 dispose of And deliver each of said lot as herein after directed I
 give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Wright Charlotte
 Borden Rachel Shaw - in of the five lots of negro slaves ^{before} men-
 tioned to each to be delivered to them respectfully immediately after
 my decease. and also I give my said daughters Elizabeth Charlotte
 and Rachel one fifth part of all the rest and residue of my estate
 each not already ~~divided~~ devised and bequeathed including the
 remainder of such negro slaves and other personal estate already
 bequeathed to my wife Sarah Beck for her natural life to have
 and to hold to them my said Elizabeth Charlotte & Rachel and
 their heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my son John Beck &
 my son in law Colin Shaw their heirs & Eys or administrators

in trust to and for the use of my daughter Sarah Hill for + during her natural life one of the four lots of negro slaves first before herein mentioned to be delivered to them the said John + Colin or their representatives immediately after my decease, and also I give and bequeath to them the said John + Colin their heirs + Exors or Adms the one fifth part of the residue of all my estate not already devised and bequeathed to my wife Sarah Beck + Alfred Beck including the remainder of such negro slaves and other personal estate as I have already given to my wife Sarah for her life to have and to hold the same to them and their heirs Exors + Adms to for and the use and benefit of the said Sarah during her natural life and it is my will that after the death of my said daughter Sarah that the whole of the said property so given in trust go to with of the children of her the said Sarah as shall be living at her death to them and her heirs for ever - I give and bequeath to my grand son William Beck Schiltz the one remaining lot of the before mentioned in four lots of my said negro slaves to be divided as aforesaid by my Exors and also one fifth part of all the rest and residue of my estate not herein already devised and bequeathed to my wife Sarah Beck and my son Albert Beck including the remainder of such ~~estate~~ of my negro slaves and other personal estate as I have already bequeathed to my said wife Sarah for her life to him and his heirs for ever provided he the said William Beck Schiltz shall live to the age of twenty one but should he die before he becom of that age then and in that case it is my will and desire that the whole of the estate herein bequeathed to him shall upon that event be equally divided amongst all my children and their heirs for ever, and it is my will and desire that my Exors retain in their hands the whole of the property herein given to him the said William Beck Schiltz until he shall arriv at the age of twenty one years should he live to that age and apply the annual profits of the same property towards his education so far as necessary and the balance if any to be paid to him when he shall arriv at the age of twenty one years but should he die before that age then such remaining profits together with the property immediately to be divided and paid to my children as aforesaid and it is my will and pleasure that said division of my negro slaves herein bequeathed be divided by

lot or sale at the discretion of my Executors, and I do hereby
 revoke and make null all and every other will or wills hereto made
 by me and lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Alfred
 Beck and my son in law Thomas Wright my Exrs to this my last will
 and testament signed sealed and executed this the 26th day of Dec 1813

Then was the will proved in open court by the oath of Henry Bond
 and ordered to be recorded + at the same time Martha Price testified
 as Exrx to the will ordered that letters were - James Penrose Clerk
 In the name of God amos that I Joseph Price of the County of Duplin State
 of North Carolina being of sound mind and ^{perfect} memory but weak
 in health do make and ordain this my last will and testament in
 manner + form as follows viz. In the first place I give and bequest
 with my beloved wife Martha Price one negro man name Simon one
 negro woman named Jean one negro woman ^{named} Minnie to her during
 her natural life and at her death to be equally divided amongst my male
 children. Then I give and bequest unto my daughter Mary Jane Hicks
 children the sum of three hundred dollars to be raised out of my
 estate or a negro girl to be purchased but ⁱⁿ left the hands of my Exrs
 until the children become of age and then to be equally divided
 between them. and should my Exrs buy a negro for her heirs and it does not
 appear to do well I give them power to sell and purchase another. Then I
 give and bequest unto my beloved ^{Roche A. Price} daughter Elyza Price + Amanda Price
 a negro woman named Mahala and her increase to be equally divided
 between them. if either of them should die then deceased part be
 equally divided between my two sons John + William. Then I give
 and bequest ^{unto} my beloved son Francis Price a piece of land lately ^{purchased} ~~from~~
 from Henry if my estate or my other children does not cover no
 part of the property will to them in consequence of my standing his security
 and should be not let my Exrs pay no money for him this, my
 will that the Exrs make him a good vest which I authorize
 them to do. Should he fail to make payment. I empower my Exrs
 to sell the land or some other property and I empower them
 to make private sale of any property if they think it will be
 to advantage. I also give him ^{power} ~~power~~ of thirty acres ^{on} the
