

east side of Rockfish that is what I intend for him - except his part  
 of the negroes before mentioned, which is to be equally divided amongst  
 my male children. Item I give and bequeath <sup>to be</sup> my beloved son John S. Brier  
 all my Land lying west of Rockfish. I also give ~~him~~ one feather bed  
 and furniture. I give and bequeath <sup>William</sup> to ~~my~~ wife all my Cavel on the  
 east side of Rockfish, that is to say, to the place where I now live  
 also one bed and furniture, should either of them die before he or she  
 the whole is to belong to the other. But leaving the land freely in possession  
 of my wife on both sides of Rockfish leaving it in the power of my Exs  
 to rent out any part privately. I agree that my wife Martha Brier  
 keep a Supprencey of my passable property as necessary but to run  
 the shedras and make no charge against them for board & room &c. I  
 further leave it in my will that my Exs see publicly <sup>or privately</sup> a piece of  
 land of five hundred acres on the north east river for the purpose  
 of paying my just debts. I do authorise and appoint Martha Brier  
 and William Stalling, Esq, to this my last will and testament  
 my witness & have here unto set my hand and seal. Feb. 20th.

 before the court and qualified as such according to law and order that  
 witness were accordingly Just W<sup>m</sup> Jackson C.C. In the name of God  
 Amen. I William Beck of Duplin County North Carolina known that it  
 is meet for all men to die do therefore desire and will at this time  
 William being possessed of a sound mind and memory blessed by God for the  
 Beck. same do express and direct that is known my temporal estate shall be  
 disposed of after my decease - this therefore my will and desire that the  
 same be in the manner and form following that is to say. I give and  
 bequeath to my beloved wife Fael orat Beck one negro man slave  
 called Andy one negro woman name Vinice and and her child  
 called Belarey also one negro boy call Peter and one young bay mare  
 called Creeping late also three cows & calver three sows and pigs  
 & three ewes & lambs two feather beds and furniture together with  
 as much of my House hold & Kitchen furniture as my Executress may

think need pay. Item. I give and bequeath to my two children Amy Jane Beck & William Jake Beck to them and their heirs forever all the residue of my personal estate after my just debts are paid to be equally divided to them thence at the time my daughter Amy Jane Beck arrives at the age of twenty one years or get married. Item my will & desire that my plantation tract a parcel of land containing nine hundred acres be the same more or less situated being and lying in the County of Robeson that I purchased from James and Archibald McFail of said county should be sold by my executors which I vest with full power and authority to give a good and lawful title in fee simple. Item my will and desire that one third part of the money arising from the sale of the tract lying in Robeson County should be by my executors laid out for a convenient plantation for my beloved wife said mare Beck which said plantation which purchased I had to my beloved wife during her natural life item after the decease of my beloved wife my desire is that the said plantation should be equally divided between my two children Amy Jane Beck & W. J. Beck to them and their heirs forever the residue of the money arising from the sale of said land in the County of Robeson what collected by my executors my desire is should be laid for likely young negroes which I give to my two children James Beck & W. J. Beck to have and them heirs forever to be divided between them at the age of twenty one years or at the marriage of my said daughter and I do hereby revoke and make null and void other will or wills hereto fore by me made and I do hereby nominate and appoint my wife Sarah M. Beck and my brother John Beck my executors to this my last will and testament signed sealed and executed this 7th of February 1804 in presence of Levi Bondin Alfred Beck B. Homeguy
