 In the name of God amen the second day of September in the year of our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and ninety. I John Beck of Duplin County and State of North Carolina being at this time sick and weak of body but of sound mind and memory possessed of God for the same and calling to mind the mortality of the body and that it is appointed unto all men once to die do constitute and make this my will in manner and form following. That is to say first and principally of all I give and bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it me and my body I recommend to the earth from whence it was taken to be burned in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my Exes hereafter to be mentioned and as to my

worldly good with which it has pleased God Almighty to  
 bless me with in this life, I give and devise in manner &  
 form following. (To Wit) And first my will and desire that all my  
 Lawful debts be satisfied. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter  
 Ann Beck two negroes to wit Tom & Abby to her and her heirs  
 forever. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Beck one feather  
 bed & furniture & two cows & calves. Item I give and bequeath &  
 devise to my two grand sons Benjamin & Silvan Brown, to tracts  
 or parcels of land which I bought of my son John Beck the  
 one tract lying on the permanent branch containing two  
 hundred acres and the other tract or parcel of land lying  
 on the north side of the Bear pond perryman containing fifty  
 acres to be equally divided between them to them and their  
 heirs forever. (Item) I give to my daughter Charity Wright one  
 negro boy name Lucy Frank and one bed and furniture &  
 two cows and calves which she has in possession to her &  
 her heirs forever. (Item) I give and bequeath to my daughter
