I give & bequeath to my honored mother Martha Blackborn one bed and furniture one brookiron two pots + one frying pan one bayson one dish an two plates one dozen of spoons two Jugs one great wheel one pr cotton cards two pair one tub one pigen one sifter and all the spun cotton and the cotton that is to spin two bottles one half a pint bottle one mug three cups the stills and to my mother her life time and then to be returned to Jerey Hamock on condition

to offer one Chitt two horses and one ox one grubbing hoe one plow one plow for one testament the book entitled the whole duty of man and the book called the seven pems I give to my mother six cows + calves four two year old steers two year old heifer my horse horse saddle + bridle and my horse the remainder to be divided divided equally between my mother and Jersey three cows or twenty forty to my mother + three to Jerey. I give to Jerey two cows and calves two cows + one yearling — <sup>two</sup> ~~one~~ year old heifer, one year old heifer one man + belt one great pot, one dish one bayson one little shirt

+ one bed with one rug two sheets two earth Jugs two bottles three cups one broad ax one chisel two augus one rope one hand saw one frow one round shave one cory one gypete one pr of irons one wedg one taper bit one gimlet one gim one pr stirruch irons one pair of bridle bits one hoe. Willed and bequeathed & attified and confirmed this and no other to be this my last will and testament, and witness whereunto I have set my hand and seal the day and year above written signed sealed published and proclaimed, declared by the said William Blackborn of his last will and testament in the presence of Towneman Breadwell, Binj<sup>his</sup> Blackborn (W<sup>mark</sup> Blackborn seal)

 Blaud five shillings (Stone) I give and bequeath to my son Charles  
 Blaud 5 shillings (Stone) I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary  
 Parker one side saddle & my hogs (Stone) I give and bequeath to  
 my son James Blaud all the gods of mine that he has on hand or  
 in his possession. (Stone) I give and bequeath to my son John Blaud  
 5 shillings. (Stone) I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Blaud 5  
 shillings, William Blaud and James Blaud whom I con-  
 stitute the sole Exors of this my last will and testament in  
 witness I have in the presents of their evidences here unto set my  
 hand and fastned my seal this the 19th day of march in the year of  
 our Lord 1775 Signed, sealed published and pronounced and
