I, W. A. Hall, of the City of Wilmington,
 State of North Carolina, hereby make and declare
 this to be my last will and testament, to-wit:

First: I direct my executor to pay out of
 my estate all my just debts and funeral and
 burial expenses, including the necessary marking
 of my grave; and I also authorize my said Ex-
 ecutor to place at the grave of my deceased wife,
 Katty, a stone, at any expense not to exceed one
 Hundred (\$100⁰⁰) Dollars.

Second: I give, devise, and bequeath
 all the rest and residue of my property, both
 real and personal, to my son George Hall,
 and to my two grand-children, George Hall, Jr.
 and Ada Lee Hall, to be divided equally among
 them, share and share alike.

I nominate and appoint the Wilmington
 Savings and Trust Company as my Executor, and
 authorize and empower it to sell, convey, and
 transfer any property which may belong to my
 estate in order to settle up and distribute same.

Last Will & Testament of William M^c Carre

In the name of God, Amen. The 10th
 day of September, 1793, I, William M^c Carre
 Son of Duplin, being sick of body but of
 sound memory thank be to God therefore, and
 calling to mind the mortality of my body
 and that it is appointed for all flesh
 to die I do make this my last will
 and testament in manner and form
 following declaring this & this only to be my
 last will and testament, revoking all others
 by me heretofore made by writing or
 otherwise.

First I commend my soul to God that
 gave it me Hoping that I may receive a
 pardon of all my sins and a gracious
 reception through the merits of my Lord and
 Saviour, Jesus Christ. My body I commend
 to the Earth from whence it came to be
 buried in a decent and Christian-like
 manner without pomp or vanity at the
 discretion of my Executors hereafter to be named
 not doubting but I will be raised up in
 glory at the last day through the mighty
 power of Almighty God.

And as to what worldly Estate God has
 blessed me with I give and bequeath it in
 manner and form following after the pay-
 ments of all my debts and funeral expenses.

First I give and bequeath to my son
 Nathaniel one hundred and twenty five acres
 of my land on Bealen formerly the property
 Henry Gustave McCullough to him and his heirs
 forever.

Secondly I give and bequeath to my
 Son William M^c Carre all my rights and

title to a piece of land on Island Creek in New Hanover County known by the name of Jamison's old field to him and his heirs forever also his bed and furniture that he has rec'd and all the money he has received from my estate.

Thirdly I give to my daughter Jane one bed and furniture & to her son William I give my negro girl Hagar to him and his heirs forever.

Fourthly - I give & bequeath to son Hugh M^c Canne the land and plantation I now live on also my wench Phillis and her two youngest children red and linrick to him and his heirs forever also my Snap horse and old mare and colt by the name of Nick also the remainder of my cattle and logs also all my plantation tools Lounch and kitchen furniture also one bed and furniture;

Fifthly - I give to my daughter, Sarah, one feather bed and furniture and to the first child she shall have in wedlock I give my negro girl Nell to it and its heirs forever and for want of that child to remain her own property at her own disposal.

Sixthly It is my will and desire that my son Thomas M^c Canne have one hundred and twenty five acres of my land upon Garden formerly the property of sd. M^c Cullough to him and his heirs forever also my negro Sam to & my Bay horse Stateman and if he please to put my mare to the horse he shall have the colt also what cattle he has received and all the logs in his track also one

feather bed and furniture which he has

Seventhly - It is my will and desire that my Brother Hugh M^c Canne have fifty acres of land upon Garden all which land to be laid of at the discretion of my Executors.

And last of all I do appoint my son Hugh M^c Canne, Robert Sloan and John Carr, my whole and sole Executors of this my last will and testament.
