She was the wife of Wm Houston in open Court in the form of law before the courts of
 William Houston and Benjamin Smith two of Subscribers Massachusetts at the same time
 Benjamin Rhoads and Wm Thomas Executors their names come before Court
 also I swelled by taking the oath of an Executor according to law
 ordered that letters executors accordingly

In the Name of God Amen.

I Timothy Teachey of the State of North Carolina and County of Beaufort
 being Me and Body but same in Mine and Memory blessed be God for
 the same calling to mind the uncertainty of life and knowing it is appointed
 for all men once to die do make and ordain this to be my last Will and
 Testament Revoking all other Wills before made by me hitherto.

Firstly I bequeath my Son to god who gave it me and true my Body having
 decent burial at the discretion of my Executors their fees Nominal and
 that all my just debts be paid of which there is not money.

Secondly I give and bequeath unto Moley Teachey the tract of Land on
 which I now live on Little Roanoke River about six hundred acres
 to his own use and that he have full possession of the same during
 his life and after his death to be Equally divided betwixt Peter Daniel
 Teachey Son of Jacob Teachey and the heirs of Timothy Teachey dead,
 to claim and this his grantees.

Thirdly I give and bequeath unto Moley Teachey what Capital may be on
 the premises with all my Stock of Cattle Horses Cows and sheep
 With all my plantation tools and household furniture of every
 Nature and Kind whatsoever with one gift to own ever forever

Fourthly I give and bequeath unto James Teachey and his Master Moley
 Teachey the Negro mentioned Negroes to wit Gladwin Wiley Dorit Tony
 Jack Mary Magrath John Jr. Bill Charles Robert Isaac Eliza & Hannah
 with their issues as the above mentioned Negroes ~~Eliza & Hannah~~
 to be Equally divided between the said James Teachey and Master
 as soon as his my master as the my slaves and after the death
 of his master Moley Teachey the residue of what Negroes that may pass
 to his share to be the property of James Teachey and his heirs forever

Fifthly I give and bequeath unto Henry Teachey Son of Jacob Teachey one
 of Jacob Teachey dead, Eight hundred acres of land lying on
 both sides of Oaky Branch to be Equally divided between them to
 them and their heirs forever.

Sixthly I give and bequeath unto Ann W. Bonny one Negroe man named
 Sam and Two hundred acres of land lying on the Shores of a river

Seventhly give and bequeath unto Mary H. Teachey daughter of David
 Teachey and One Negroe boy named Jacob and one Negroe girl
 named Mary to her and her heirs forever. I will unto Michael
 Teachey Son of Jacob Teachey dead, one Negroe boy named
 Jim with fifty barrels Gunpowder to him and his heirs
