Benjamin Rhoads & my son William Thomas Executors of this

being married but have in mind and memory blessed be God for
the same believe to mind the uncertainty of life and knowing it is appointed
for all men once to die do make and ordain this to be my last Will and
Testament Revoking all other Wills heretofore made by me heretofore.

First I bequeath my land to god who gave it me and leave my Body honest
decent burial at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and
that all my just debts be paid of which there is not money.

Secondly I give and bequeath unto Henry Teaching the tract of land on
which I now live on Little Rock Creek containing about six hundred acres
to his own use and that the said Henry Teaching of the same during
his life and after his decease to be Equally divided between Daniel
Teaching Son of Jacob Teaching and the heirs of Timothy Teaching dead
to share and this his forever.

Thirdly I give and bequeath unto Henry Teaching what property may be on
the premises with all my stock of Cattle horses dogs and sheep
with all my plantation tools and these goods furniture of every
nature and kind whatsoever with one gift to own and forever.

Fourthly I give and bequeath unto James Teaching and his mother Henry
Teaching the three mentioned Negroes to wit Abraham Miley Dorris Tony
Jack Mary Magraw John Jun. Bill, Charles Adam Isaac Eliza & Sarah
with this in case as the above mentioned Negroes ~~Eliza & Sarah~~
to be Equally divided between the said James Teaching and Mother
as soon as I see my decease as the my this group and after the decease
of his mother Henry Teaching the residue of what Negroes there may be
to her share to be the property of James Teaching and his heirs forever.

Fifthly I give and bequeath unto Henry Teaching Son of Jacob Teaching Son
of Jacob Teaching dead, Eight hundred acres of land lying on
both sides of Crany Branch to be Equally divided between them to
share and this his forever.

Sixthly I give and bequeath unto Ann M. Bonny one Negro man named
Sam and two hundred acres of land lying on the same place on
Seventhly I give and bequeath unto Mary H. Teaching daughter of David
Teaching dead, one Negro Boy named Jacob and one Negro Girl
named Mary to her and her heirs forever I will unto Michael
Teaching Son of Jacob Teaching dead, one Negro boy named
John with fifty barrels of gunpowder to him and his heirs forever.
