Should have the Mainier plantation containing one hundred
Acres he also desires that his son Benjamin Thomas
Should have the plantation that is Benjamin was
living on with the land belonging to the Survey he
also desires that his grand sons Ezekiel Charles and
Lawrence Thomas should have two hundred acres
of land lying on the waters of Sutton to be equally divided
between his ~~children~~ the 8th Ezekiel and Lawrence. he
also desires that all his stock of Cattle should be
equally divided between his children June 11th 1785.
This day the undersigned witnesses came before me
Made oath that the above witness was when they heard
William Thomas desire on his death Bed June 9th 1785

Item It is my desire that the Money due me for my lands from Lucy
Blair should be laid out with in the purchase of other lands
and that my Beloved wife Lydia Underhill have a quiet and
peaceable possession of the lifetime and then to be
equally & divided betwix my two Sons Joseph Underhill
and Jerry Underhill

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Lydia Underhill
all the rest of my property that has not already been named
also the use of my Negro girl Luisa during her natural life

Item I give unto my Son in law William Thompson his Shillings.

Item I give unto my Daughter Dorothy her Shillings

Item I give unto my Anna Underhill his Shillings
and I hereby make and ordain my above named Joseph
Underhill and my worthy friend John Bond and William
Pallor Executors to this my last Will and Testament
In witness whereof I the said William Underhill have & done
my last Will and Testament by my hand and seal the day
and year above written. Signed sealed published and declared
by the said William Underhill the testator as his last
Will and Testament in the presence of us who are present
at the time of signing and sealing thereof

last Will and Testament in manner and form following
W^t. First recommend my Soul to God that gave it me and my
Body to live Christian like Ruric at the Resurrection of my Soul
hereinafter to be named Secound I will and ordain that as so
Much of the perishable part of my property may be sold as will
pay all my just debts and funeral Expences.

Thirdly. I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Jane
Young. One Milne and one half of any Stock of Cattle and
Hogs and Sheep. and also my household Furniture
and plantation tools, &c. &c. for another forever

Forthly I give and bequeath to my Son James Young
One hundred Acre of Land including the plantation
wherein and now lies, and one Horse Saddle & Bridle,
and the one half of the remaining part of my Stock of Cattle
Hogs and Sheep. & house hold Furniture and plantation tools
to him and his Heirs forever.

Fifthly I will and ordain that after my decease that
the above mentioned Cattle Hogs and Sheep & house hold
Furniture of every Nature and Kind to be equally divided
between the said Jane Young and my Son James Young

Sixthly I will and ordain that my beloved wife Jane Young
have peaceable and quiet Possession on the plantation

& now live during her life.

Seventhly I give bequeath to my Sons John Young William Young
and Peter Young five Shillings Sterling Cash to them and
and their Heirs forever

Eighthly I will and ordain that my two daughters Margaret
Brown and Ann Blanton here give Shillings Sterling Cash
to them and their Heirs forever

Ninthly. And last I constitute and appoint my brother friend
Timothy Teachey as Executor to this my last will and testament
and my beloved wife Jane Young Executrix in testimony
hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this

20th day of November 1799
