death Bed as to wit. He desired that his son John Thomas
should have the mainer plantation containing one hundred
acres He also desired that his son Benjamin Thomas
should have the plantation that I Benjamin was
living on with the land belonging to the S. Harvey He
also desired that his hand sons Egidius and
Lawrence Thomas should have two hundred acres
of land lying on the waters of Suttons to be equally divided
between his ~~sons~~ the S. Egidius and Lawrence. He
also desired that all his stock of Cattle should be
equally divided between his children June 11th 1785.
This day the under subscribed Witnesses came before me
made oath that the above written was what they heard

I William Underhill of North Carolina and County of Wayne
being of sound and perfect Mind and memory bless God do this
Twenty fifth day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand
Eight hundred & one make and publish this my last Will and
Testament in manner following that is to say.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph Underhill my Negro
girl Manu Lusa and not to have her until the death of my beloved
wife Epiza Underhill & it is my desire that my son Jerry
Underhill have the first child that the above named Negro girl
Lusa shall bear -

Item I give unto my son William Underhill all the money due me
from Robert Merrill which is Forty Pounds & two shillings & the
money he owes me which is six pounds

Item It is my desire that the money due me for my lands from Long
Island should be laid out with in the purchase of other lands
and that my beloved wife Epiza Underhill have a quiet and
peaceable possession of it for life time and then to be
equally & divided between my two sons Joseph Underhill
and Jerry Underhill

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Epiza Underhill
all the rest of my property that has not already been named
also the use of my Negro girl Lusa during her natural life

Item I give unto my son in law William Johnston five shillings.

Item I give unto my daughter Sarah Underhill five shillings

Item I give unto my Anna Underhill five shillings

And I hereby move and ordain my beloved wife Epiza
Underhill and my loving friend John Goss and William
Palmer Executors to this my last Will and Testament

In Witness Whereof I the said William Underhill have hereunto
set my last Will and Testament by my hand and seal the day
and year above written signed sealed published and delivered
by the said William Underhill the Testator as his last
Will and Testament in the presence of us who were present
at the time of signing and sealing thereof

I Peter Young of the State of North Carolina and County of Wayne being of perfect mind and memory blessed be God calling to mind the uncertainty of life and having it appeared that for all men once to die. Now and ordain this to be my last will and Testament in manner and form following Viz: First I bequeath my Soul to God who gave it me and my body to God Christian like Burial at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter to be named Secondly I will and ordain that as much of the perishable part of my property may be sold as will pay all my just debts and funeral Expenses.

Thirdly. I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Jane Young one mair and one half of any Stock of Cattle and Hogs and Sheep and also my house hold furniture and plantation tools to her and her heirs forever.

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my son James Young one hundred acres of land including the plantation wherein our now live and one horse saddle & Bridle and the one half of the remaining part of my Stock of Cattle Hogs and Sheep & house hold furniture and plantation tools to him and his heirs forever.

Fifthly I will and ordain that after my decease that the above mentioned Cattle Hogs and Sheep & house hold furniture of every Nature and kind to be equally divided between the said Jane Young and my son James Young.

Sixthly I will and ordain that my beloved wife Jane Young have peaceable and quiet Possession on the plantation

I now live during her life.

Seventhly I give bequeath to my sons John Young William Young and Peter Young five shillings Sterling each to them and their heirs forever.

Eighthly I will and ordain that my two daughters Margaret Brown and Ann Stanton have five shillings Sterling each to them and their heirs forever.

Ninthly and last I constitute and appoint my worthy friend Timothy Teashey as Executor to this my last will and Testament and my beloved wife Jane Young Executors in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th day of November 1799.
