In the name of God Amen. I William Wallerman Planter of the State  
and County aforesaid being of an infirm state of body but of sound mind  
and memory do make constitute and ordain this to be my last will  
and testament and by these presents do disannul all former wills testament  
etc. And I resign my soul to the merciful hands of God who gave it  
and my body to be buried in Christianlike manner after disposition  
of my executors etc. And as to the worldly property with which it has  
pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath in the following  
manner viz I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Wallerman  
the three following negroes viz Beach, Primus and Charney slaves  
to her and her heirs forever at her own disposal also five cows and  
calves two feather beds and furniture also my household and  
Plantations with the plantations tools house hold furniture and shop  
tools during her natural life or widowhood and after her decease  
to be divided equally my other children Elizab<sup>t</sup> and Susanna with the request to some one of them to

buy the Plantations except as much of the furniture as shall be disposed of otherwise  
I also give and bequeath to her my stock of hogs sheep and horses her heirs to find  
in her I give to her my beloved wife and I wish to be kept and maintained during  
her life time also my negro boy and young black during her life or widowhood then  
to be valued and go to make up the lots of negroes left to my wife and three  
children equal as near as possible Second I give and bequeath to beloved and  
dearly the three following negroes viz Sam Rose and Edith which negroes  
he has already in possession also one feather bed and furniture and  
money already received by him viz one hundred and twenty six dollars  
to him and his heirs forever etc Thirdly I give and bequeath to my beloved  
daughter Elizabeth Edwards three negroes viz Jane Flora + Ireland  
which negroes she has in possession also two cows and calves two feather  
beds and furniture one yoke of oxen four sows and pigs four cows and  
lambs and two heifers all of which she has already in her possession  
fourthly I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Susanna the three  
negroes viz Eliza Hannah and Lander also two cows and calves four  
sows and pigs four cows and lambs and two feather beds and furniture  
when she marries or comes of age It is also my will and desire that all  
my debts be paid off out of debts due to me by note or otherwise and the  
rest divided equally among my ..... in day and date aforesaid and in  
the presence of us etc
