 be paid and payment thereunto I give and bequeath to
 my son Thomas J. J. five shillings Sterling by reason I have
 advanced to him all ready as much as my ability will allow
 I give and bequeath unto my Son John J. J. five shillings
 Sterling by reason I have advanced to him all ready as much as my ability will allow

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth
Ivey one Side Saddle one Limning Wheel which is
called 'Neri' one box iron and twenty pounds
proclamation money

I give and Bequeath to my daughter Sarah
Ivey twenty five pounds proclamation money
To her and her Heirs I give and Bequeath
To my daughter Martha Ivey twenty five
Pounds proclamation money to be paid
To her when arriving at the age of twenty years
I give and Bequeath to my son
Lewis Ivey the plantation that I bought
of Mr. Vegetens containing two Hundred
acres of land and one young horse and
Saddle and all the cattle with a half man
in a bar and fifty Pounds free money to be
Paid to him at the age of twenty years
and one third year. I give and Bequeath
to my well beloved Wife One Side Saddle and
Limning Wheel which she calls 'Neri' and One Limning
Wheel and six hundred pounds of Hot Pork and four
Hundred Pounds of Beef and ten Barrels of Indian Corn
I give and Bequeath to my well beloved Wife One Feather Bed &
furniture to be my own property if we live and then to be
divided between the two of us the use of my dwelling house
and as much land as I owned with my own stock and
cattle and during my life and the life of my wife and

To my beloved wife Fifty Pound: Proclamation money.
till my son George comes to the age of Twenty One
Years after then thirty Pound: to be paid to him and the other
Twenty Pound: after her decease the same to become due to
son George by Item I Give and bequeath to my dear
Mary Tody Twenty five Pound: Proclamation money to
be paid to her at the age of Twenty Years Item I Give &
bequeath to my son Benjamin Tody the Plantation now
in use containing Two hundred and Eighty five Acres
of Land and after all this is Included the remainder of
my Estate to my son Benjamin Tody and his Heirs for
ever and of this my will I make constitute nominate
ordain and appoint my well beloved son Benjamin Tody
my whole and sole Executor Revoking annulling all
former and other Wills by me heretofore Ratifying and
confirming this and no other to be my last Will and
Testament when I shall be at my hand and witness on
the Day and Year above written Witness my hand
and my hand and seal of the said Benjamin Tody
Proclaimed and Declared by the said Executor to be his last
Will & Testament in the Presence of us Robert Turner
Nathan Boone Joseph Turner.
