 Die do make & Ordain this my last Will
 & Testament that is to say I give & bequeath
 of first of all I give & Recommend my Soul
 into the Hands of God that gave it and
 for my Body I Recommend it to the Earth
 to be Buried in a Christian like & Decent
 Manner at the Discretion of my Executors
 nothing Doubting but at the General Resur-
 rection I shall Rise in the same Again
 by the mighty Power of God and on touching
 such worldly Estate as at such & passing
 to my Heirs with in this life I give Devise
 & bequeath of the same in Manner & form
 following that is to say
 I give & bequeath unto my Son Jonathan
 my Plantation whereon Oliver Dewell and
 I intended & lately Acres of land there to wit
 of 200 acres to him and his Heirs & assigns for ever
 I give & bequeath unto my Son John Acres of land
 the Plantation whereon his father lived and on
 Hundred Acres of land formerly belonging
 to him & his Heirs & assigns

And if he shall Dy. without Heir of his
Body I give & Bequeath unto my Daughter
Sarah the said land & Plantation to her
& her Heirs & Assigns for ever

I also give & Bequeath unto my son Jonathan
all that Piece of land lying on the North side
of Back River between my land & John Stalls
line to him & his Heirs and Assigns for ever
I give & Bequeath unto my Daughter Tabitha
my Plantation on Back River and ten Acres
& ninety two Acres of land thereto Belonging
to her & her Heirs & Assigns for ever

I give & Bequeath to Rachel my Dearly beloved
Wife all my Personal Estate During her
Natural life & after her Decease I leave it to be
Equally Divided Among all my Children that
is a Son at present and their Heirs for ever

I also make & Ordain my Loving Wife Rachel
Coleman & my son Jonathan Coleman my
only & sole Executors of this my Last Will & Testament
and I do hereby Wholly Disallow Repulse
and Disannul all & every former & former
Will & Legacies Bequests & Gifts by me in
any way or for this time Revoked, Null & of
no Effect. Ratifying & Confirming this and
the same to be my Last Will & Testament in
Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my Hand
& Day & year Above Written
