OBITUARY OF MAJOR MICAJAH PETWAY OF EDGECOMBE COUNTY

NORTH CAROLINA.

This article was copied from the notice of Major Petway's death which appeared in the May 2nd 1849 issue of the Tarboro Free Press, Tarboro, North Carolina.

The Rocky Mount chapter of the National Spciety, Daughters of the American Revolution, is named in honor of Major Petway.

OBITUARY OF MAJOR MICAJAH PETWAY.

Died in Edgecombe County, North Carolina, on the twelth untimo. Micajah Petway in the ninety-second year of his age.

The deceased was the last but one of the Army of the Revolution in Edgecombe County, was born near this place and at an early period of our struggle entered the Army and served almost unremittingly until the close of the War.

Few served longer and few rendered more efficient service. For six months he formed one of that stern and unyielding band, technically called body-guard, which stood like a wall of adamant around the person of the Commander-in-Chief. In the dark hours of battle he fought side by side with young Lafayette at Brandywine and mingled his shouts with the victors in the terrible assault on Stonington Heights by the head-strong and impetuous Wayne.

He was called by acclamation to the command of the Company raised in 1812 in Edgecombe County and marched at its head to Norfolk, sharing all its privations and hardships of that disasterous garrison.

Of all patriots in Edgecombe County, North Carolins, during the Revolutionary War period none gave more distinguished services than Colonel Exum Lewis. In the year 1776 he was appointed colonel of the Edgecombe County militia, succeeding Col. William Haywood, in which capacity he rendered unfailing aid to the cause of freedom and liberty.

The family of Col. Exum Lewis was among the first to settle in Edgecombe County, coming from the neighboring state of Virginia in the early days of the county. As early as 1760 Richard Lewis, the father of Exum Lewis, is mentioned as serving on the grand jury for a special session of Court held in the vacinity of Tyrancoca Creek, later known as Cokey Swamp. At this same session of Court another prominent citizen of early Edgecombe took his oath as a Justice of the Peace, Elisha Battle.

Very little is known of the brothers and sisters of Col. Exum Lewis. But is of record that Col. Lewis himself married Elizabeth Figures, of a fine Southampton County, Virginia, family and they reared a large family in Edgecombe County, North Carolina. Col.
