# THE LAWRENCE FAMILY OF EDGECOMBE COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA.

I John Lawrence, first of the family in Edgecombe County, died there in 1795. He served in the Revolutionary War. The family originally settled in Bertie County, N.C. where many of their descendants now live.

John Lawrence married Abby, whose surname is not of record. After his death she married a Staton of Edgecombe Co. The children of John and Abby Lawrence were:

II Joshua Lawrence, son of John and Abby Lawrence, prominent Baptist preacher of Edgecombe County, married Mary Knight, daughter of John Knight of a well-known Colonial family of the county. As early as 1741 members of the Knight family were active in the support of the Episcopal faith in Edgecombe county. Joshua Lawrence himself was converted to the Baptist faith at the age of twenty-three, was baptised at the early Church of the Falls of Tar River, on the outskirts of Rocky Mount, N.C. and became in time the fiery champion of the Primitive or "Old Baptists" during the long, bitter struggle between that Church and the Missionary Baptists in Edgecombe Co. This history of the Pearsall family is taken from an article by A.T. Outlaw under the scription "Our Yesterdays-- History, Biography, genealogy."

This article appeared in the September 23rd 1937 issue of the Duplin Times, of Duplin County, North Carolina, issue number 37. A clipping of the article is now in the possession of Mrs. D. M. Pearsall, 620 Hammond Street, Rocky Mount, North Carolina.

According to a notation on the clipping, Mr. Outlaw is (or was in 1937) Clerk of the Court at Kenansville and also secretary of the Grady-Outlaw Reunion.



## THE PEARSALL FAMILY

Captain James Pearsall, son of Edward and Catherine Pearsall, was born in the Welsh settlement of New Hanover (now Pender) County during the year 1750. His father was a cooper and came to the Welsh settlement from Chester County, Pennsylvania during the seventeen-forties. After the death of his father, the mother and her children located in the Grove settlement of Duplin County and she became the wife of Colonel Thomas Routledge.

In the beginning of the Revolutionary War Captain Pearsall, like his step-father, Colonel Routledge, became an outstanding American patriot. He was an officer in the Duplin militia and participated in a number of campaigns and engagements.

At the close of the war he received a grant from the State for a tract of one thousand acres of land in Maury County, Tennessee, for military services. On January 21st, 1785 he gave a deed to Duplin County for four acres of land "for the purpose of building thereon a courthouse, prison and stocks" and a courthouse was built on the same site as the present building. It is said that the acceptance of Captain Pearsall's offer of four acres was largely on account of the "cool spring" near the square and which is still flowing a steady stream of pure, healthful water. The spring had been discovered long before that time by Miss Barbara Gaster who later married Captain Beveret, a seaman, and after his death she married Joseph Carr. Many of their descendants have been prominently identified with public affairs.

Directly after the war Captain Pearsall was elected Sheriff and served in that capacity for a period of about four years. He was a member of the State Constitutional Convention of 1789 and represented Duplin County as a member of the State House of Commons, sessions of 1791 and 1793. He was a man of large affairs, a planter, and operated a tavern near the courthouse for many years.

Captain Pearsall died November 12th, 1812, in the sixty-third year of his age. He married first Zilphia Uzzell, daughter of Thomas and Catherine Uzzell of Dobbs (Lenoir) County; second Feraby Whitfield, daughter of Barbara (Williams) and Constantine Whitfield of Craven County; and third Anne Dickson, daughter of Jane (Molten) and Joseph Dickson. ## The Hilliard Family of Nash County

### North Carolina

No family in North Carolina has a more distinguished lineage than the Hilliard family.

The first American ancestor of the family, Major John Hilliard, served with the British Army in the Barbadoes and settled in Somerset County, Maryland in 1683.

First of the family in this section of North Carolina was Captain Isaac Hilliard, born in Northampton County, North Carolina, educated at William and Mary College, Williamsburg, Virginia, he built "Woodlawn" a large and beautiful manor house in that part of Edgecombe which was later on made into Nash County. He and his family lived and died at "Woodlawn" and many of them lie buried in the family graveyard there.

The tombstone inscriptions on the following pages are taken from the graveyard at "Woodlawn".

According to Bible records now in possession of Mrs. James Hilliard Polk of Fort Worth, Texas. Captain Isaac Hilliard was married to Leah Crawford, daughter of Carter Crawford Jr., of Surrey County, Virginia, and his wife Elizabeth Kearney. They were married on April the 20th 1765.
