the ling.

I give and bequeath unto my son Sam^r Spin one third of the ling

I give & bequeath unto my Nathl Spin twenty five
pounds the given money to be paid by my Executors

I give and bequeath unto my son Daniel Spin
Twenty pounds the given money to be Paid by
my Executors

- I give and Bequeath unto my son William Spier
two Hundred & fifty Acres of Land on the South
Side of Fishing Creek the Plantation he now lives
on. Saying the Land of Labins & Jo: Spier and one
Acre of Water on the North Side of Fishing Creek
at his own place Landing in Mattapony County.
I give & Bequeath unto my Grandson Nath: Wright
four Shillings Virginia Money to be paid by my
Executors.
- I give unto my son John Fredrick Spier and my
Daughter Francis Spier one Negro Girl called Noss to
them and their Heirs for ever and in case the
said Francis Spier should die without issue of
her Body, it is my Will and that the said Nige
Girl I give unto my Grandson Morris Spier
son of John Spier to him and his Heirs.
- I give & Bequeath unto my son Wright Spier
one Negro Girl named Popsy and two Hundred
Acres of Land part of the Tract of Land that
his Brother William Spier has given to him
lying back back and saying his Brother Madde
I give and Bequeath unto my son David Spier one
Negro Boy called Robin and the Plantation
lying on with two Hundred Acres of Land to him and
his Heirs only it is my Will and Desire that
my loving Wife Elizabeth Spier shall have
the Use of the Plantation and the third part of
the two Hundred Acres of Land for maintenance
to my son David Spier during her Natural
Life without Being a Natural.

I Give and Beqwith unto my son Thendred
Spin and Negro Boy called Ned and all my
Land which I have ^{not} already given to him and
his Wife my son Thendred Spin and his wife
and any child that the said Negro Boy called
Ned Give and Beqwith unto my Grandson
James Spin the son of Dempsey Spin to him
and his Wife.

Also it is my Will & Desire that my French sold
Lair should be sold to pay my Debts

Spin I Give and Beqwith to my Loving Wife all the
Most of my Estate during her Natural Life
and after her Death that I do Give and Beqwith
that Part of my Estate which I have sent to
Wife to be Equally Divided my three youngest
Sons to them and their Heirs

I do hereby Nominate & Appoint my son James
Spin and William Spin and Loving Wife
Elizabeth Spin whole Exors. Heirs of this my
last Will & Testament Revoking & Disavowing
and making Void all former Wills by me or for
me heretofore made in this Testimony, whereof
I have hereunto set my hand & seal at the 12 day of
January 1761.
