Men once to Die Therefore do make & Ordain this my Last Will &
& Testament of all my worldly Goods that it with placed and the
God to bestow upon me and I Give and bequeath in manner
as following First of all I Commit my Soul in the hands of the
Almighty God that good it find my Body to be buried in
a decent manner at the Discretion of my Executors.

I bequeath First I Give and bequeath to my beloved Wife
Children all my Estate both equally divided amongst them
my Land which I Give & bequeath to my beloved Son John
but all the rest of my worldly Estate I Give equally
divided to my beloved Wife Anne & my beloved Children whose
names are these as follows Anne, John & John. I do
bequeath them my Estate both equally & appoint my beloved Wife Anne
John and David my Executors of this my Last
Will & Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand & Seal this 13th Day of October 1762 George
Pittman. And it is remembered that I the said George
Pittman do appoint & Ordain David my Wife Anne
& John Pittman as my Trustees to do that all things to be done
my Ordained bequeathing to this my above said Will & Testament.
