 I make this my last will & Testament  
 Principally & first of all I give my soul unto the  
 hands of god that gave it by sanctifying my body I leave  
 to be buried in a Christian manner at the Discretion  
 of my Executors And as for my worldly Estate I leave  
 in the manner & form following That to day  
 I give and bequeath unto my beloved son Thos

Pridgeon one hundred acres of land lying on the  
 South side of Tar river in R. County it being the land  
 I had Will<sup>m</sup> Gaineys intencion to his heire for ever  
 One negro boy named Pompey also my Stock of  
 Black cattle in somethare neare where one peccat  
 Bed & furniture two peccat dishes two Basons  
 four plates

I give & bequeath unto my well beloved son David  
 the negro boy named Jack one horse call'd Danvers  
 my Stock of cattle in Will<sup>m</sup> Gaineys care one peccat  
 bed & furniture likewise two basins two Dishes &  
 four plates one we are to have

Also I give & bequeath unto my well beloved son Joseph one  
 tract of land lying south side same river thos

County containing two hundred and fifty acres  
Being the land purchased of John Lambourne unto  
him & his heirs for ever also one Negro fellow  
named a rooster one feather bed & furniture one  
Dish one Basin four plates

Item I give unto my son Will the plantation whereon he doth  
now live with the appertenances thereto belonging  
Containing thereunto in & his Heirs for ever also  
one bed & furniture two Basins one Dish four plates  
Item I give unto my son Will and all the rest  
belonging also one Thirtysix pence per ann money to be  
paid by his Executors when of age  
Item I give unto my Daughter Mary feathers sufficient to  
make one bed

Item I give unto my daughter Isabell one Negro woman  
and her proffers bed & furniture two Dishes two Basins  
four plates Item I give unto my Daughter Mary  
Thirtythree pounds six shillings & eight pence per ann money  
Also one one feather bed & furniture two small Basins  
two Dishes four plates to be paid at the age eighteen  
or marriage Item I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth  
Thirtythree pounds six shillings & eight pence  
proclamation money two small basins two Dishes  
four plates to be laid at the age eighteen or  
marriage Item I give unto my Daughter Margaret  
a hundred of many Whibby towels Margret had  
Received & been proceeded proclamation money Sixty  
shillings to be paid to her by Executors at the age of eighteen  
or upon marriage
