Thomas Brich's Will.

Thomas Brich, of the County of Meigs and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind & memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will & Testament, in manner & form following, that is to say:

I first: That my Executor herein after named, shall provide for my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my relations & friends, pay all funeral expenses, together with my just debts however due who soever owing, out of the moneys that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

Item: I give and devise to my beloved wife the whole of my house build of land where I now live, so also includes all buildings, furniture & in fee of her One or $\frac{2}{3}$ thirds of and in all my real estate, to have & to hold to her the said Mary Elizabeth Brich, for during the term of her natural life or widow hood to her also one cow one sheep, one breeding sow, two bee stands, 100 choice, one team of six horses, one stack of hay, three hundred pounds of bacon, twelve bushels of wheat now, and twenty four bushels of wheat after harvest, out of what is now growing, 15 ton bushels of corns;

Thomas Reich's Will continued

At the kitchen furniture to my Cook & one bed, one table, & one
looking glass, six chairs, two buckets, five sets of linen Dollars in cash;
to have first choice of all the above articles, all the land on hand, &
also fifty bushels of corn next fall out of the new crop, all the
potatoes on hand;

Item. Give & bequeath to my daughter Mariah Priscilla, single woman
one bed, one cow, and fifteen Dollars in ~~money~~ cash, to buy a carriage
and wheels, and forty-five Dollars in cash - one horse.

Item. I also will that my Executor shall sell all my personal prop-
erty not otherwise disposed of in my will, and pay over the money
that I have willed to my wife & daughter, and if there should not be
enough left to pay my just debts, my Executor shall get the
wishes of my two sons Isaac Reich & Ephraim Reich, whether
they will let the saw mill be sold, and if they agree to let it
be sold, we shall have eight acres run off, including the saw mill,
I will it to the highest bidder, & apply the money to the payment of
my debts - and if they had rather let the Rights tract be sold
we shall sell that tract, and apply the money to the same purpose.
But if my personal property pays off my debts, neither of the above
tracts of land is to be sold.

Item. I will & bequeath to my son Isaac Reich, &
to my son Isaac Reich, & to my daughter Mariah P. Reich single
woman & any other lands, to be divided in the following manner;
Ephraim shall choose one man, & Isaac shall choose one man, &
Mariah shall choose one man, - none of which shall be inter-
ested; and these men shall go on the premises, and divide the whole
of the lands, not otherwise disposed of, into three separate lots,
and they shall also value each separate lot, after they have di-
vided the same. & my two sons, & my daughter shall draw lots to
ascertain which tract each shall have, and those that get the lots
that are valued the highest, shall pay over to those that get the lots
which are not of so great a valuation.

Item. I will that my horse remains unsold until the next crop of
corn is laid by, & the few years of farming to go also, and then be
sold, and I also have one stack of oats to be sold, and a half
stack of corn, and one stack of hay, and all the produce on hand
except the horses.

Item. I give & bequeath to my well beloved wife, in addi-
tion to what I have already willed, twenty fifty pounds of bacon
& eight Dollars in cash. My Executor shall give a credit of

two months at the first sum, & 25 months until an other order by
the purchaser giving count with apparent validity.

I cordially do hereby constitute & appoint my trusty friend
John A. Myers my lawful executor to make & cause to
execute this my last will & testament, according to the true intent
& meaning of the same, and every part & clause thereof, & also by re-
ading & interpreting fairly and, at the will & testament of my premises.

In witness whereof I the said John A. Myers, doth subscribe to
and my hand I seal, this the twenty seventh day of January A.D.
one thousand eight hundred and fifty eight.
