

In the name of God Amen, I Charles Wynne Gent. of the
County of Franklin and State of North Carolina, being
of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God, do
this 6th day of August in the Year of our Lord 1825
make and Publish this my last will and testament in manner
following, that is to say

first, It is my will and desire that my Executor sell so
much of perishable Estate either privately or publicly,
as may be sufficient to pay all my Just debts -

Second, I give and bequeath to my Son Joshua Wynne
One Dollar to him and his heirs forever -

Third, I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Mosley
One Dollar to her and her heirs forever -

Fourth, I give and bequeath to my Son Williamson Wynne
One Bed and furniture, one Cow Calf and One Sow & Pigs -

Fifth, I give and bequeath to my Son Thomas Wynne
One Cow and Calf and one Sow and Pigs -

Sixth, It is my will and desire that my two Daughters
Polly and Rebecca, live and remain where I now live
and that they have the profit and benefit of all my
Estate both real and personal including my Mill, so long
as they may live single or they may die, and when they
may marry or may die then for all my Estate both
real and personal to be sold and the monies arising from
such Sale to be equally divided between my Son
Thomas, my Son Williamson, the lawful heirs of my Son
Charles, the lawful heirs of Daughter Polly Jenkins.

Seventh, It is my will and desire that my Executor shall
may sell or so dispose of any of my perishable Est.
either privately or publicly, as he may think will be
an advantage to the Estate, returning the proceeds of
sale to the Estate -

Eighth, It is my will and desire that my Executor if
should think that my son Charles and his heirs, or my
Daughter Patsy Simkins or her heirs should absolutely
in need of the necessities of life to subsist on, that he
may furnish them with the same out of my Estate, and
that he charge them with the same and for the amount
to be deducted from the proportionable part they may
receive at a general division -

I hereby make and ordain my son Thomas Wynn
Executor of this my last will and testament. In witness
whereof I the said Charles Wynn last have to this my
last will and testament set my hand and seal the 11th
and year above written
