day of the General Judgment

1. And first I Desire that all my just debts be paid according to Contract
2. I give to my Grand son John Young the spring that descendeth from the
a path way to the same
3. I give to my son John W. Young the tract or piece of land that I now live
on containing two Hundred and fifty acres to the same man or wife to him
& his heirs for ever on this condition that he is not to possess it as long as
his wife live a Widow but at or after his death then to possess the whole
for ever — but in case of Marriage it must be as the law directs
4. I lend to my loving Wife all & every thing that I possess whether money
& the of hand Household or kitchen furniture & Stocks of all kinds during her
natural life or Widowhood but in case of marriage it must be as the law
directs as above but at her death my son John W. Young will possess the
whole as his whole and sole property, as to my book if my Daughter
Elizabeth Jones or my son Samuel Young desire to have any of them
it is my desire that they might have them
- Now I disown and Revoke all former wills and testaments and make
this my last Will & Testament & I do appoint my loving Wife and
my son Samuel Young as my and my sole Executors to this my last
Will and Testament in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this
last and day and date above written
