Year of our Lord 1877 make and publish this my
last will and testament in manuscript form
Following that is to say -

My will and desire is that at my death that all
if my property be sold and the money arising therefrom
be divided in the following manner -

First I give and bequeath to my sister Milley Bridgers

The sum of Ten Shillings to her and her heirs for ever

Secondly I give unto my sister Milley Sanford the
sum of five Shillings to her and her heirs forever

And the balance of the money arising from the
sale of my property as before named I wish and my will
and desire is for it to be equally divided between my
Brothers and sister namely Fanny Bowden Allen
Bowden & Brickell Bowden to them and their heirs
for ever

And I also appoint my brother Allen Bowden my
Executor to see this my last will and testament performed
in witness of which I have here unto set my hand and
seal the day and date above written
