

Know all men by these presents that I Patrick Bladsoe,
of the county of Franklin and State of North Carolina
being of perfect mind and memory thank god
but feeling severe bodily indisposition do think proper
this the 17th day of January in the year of our Lord
eighteen hundred and thirty one to make this
my last will & testament.

In the first place I wish all my just debts paid
out of my cotton, & stock of different kinds.

In the second place for the affection which I
have for my sister Absey Cooper, I wish to convey
all the right title and interest in the tract of land
on which I now live to her during her natural
life time, after her death I wish the plantation with
the improvements sold, and the proceeds divided into
four equal parts, one of which I wish given to
Hincham Bladsoe, one fourth to Benjamin Bladsoe, one
fourth to my sister Sarah Bladsoe, and the other
fourth part of the proceeds of my land I wish
equally divided among my sister Absey Coopers
children. I further wish my black man given
to my sister Sarah Bladsoe - The balance of
my property in what was specified for the
payment of my debts, I wish equally divided ~~between~~
Benjamin Hincham & Sarah Bladsoe. I do
constitute and appoint Heskiah Terrell Executor to this my will
& testament, and likewise Toliver Terrell, Executor.
