

In the name of God Amen. I, J. P. Hardie
of Franklin County State of North Carolina
being of sound & perfect mind and
memory do this first day of October
in the year (1824) make and pub-
lish this my last will & testament
in manner following that is to say
first I give and bequeath to my loving
wife Polly the following negroes vizt
Abram Lemmey Tenney and her four
children Payton Tippo Mary John
Lam. one bed & furniture and my
riding mare Two Cows & Hides to
her and her heirs or assigns forever
also lend to my said wife all
my lands in Warren & Franklin Coun-
ties during her life and after
her deceased I give the said lands
to my nephew Whitmie Hardie and
two negroes Alfred & Hardie to him
and his heirs forever
I also give & bequeath to my niece
Laurie Hardie four negroes Harry
Booker Anthony and Benken to her
and her heirs forever

Turn over

I also give to my nephew Whitnie Hardie
the residue of my property which
I wish to be sold by my Executor and
Executor hereafter appointed upon
a credit of nine months and the
money arising from the sale of the
same to be appropriated towards edu-
cating him

And I hereby make and ordain my
brother William Hardie my Executor
and my wife Polly my Executor of this
my last will & testament In witness
whereof I have to this my last will
and testament set my hand and
seal the day and year above
written
