1st. 4th. I give and devise to my nephew W. J. McReedy and my nieces Sarah Ann and Rebecca McReedy, and thair heirs in fee simple, my track of land lying on the waters of Crowders Creek, subject to the life estate of my wife as devised in a former item of this my will, same to be equally divided according to value. Will to get the North West portion.

5th. I give to my beloved wife all my household and estate

4th. I give and devise to my nephew W.J. McReedy and my nieces Sarah Ann and Rebecca McReedy, and their heirs in fee simple, my track of land lying on the waters of Crowders Creek, subject to the life estate of my wife as devised in a former item of this my will, same to be equally divided according to value. 5th. I give to my beloved wife all my household and kitchen furniture.

6th. I hereby appoint my nephews H. Whitesides and J.J. Gamble my lawful executors to execute this my will and testament.
