I, Ann Robinson, of the County and State aforesaid, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament.

1st. My Executor hereinafter named, shall give my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives, and to the amount of my estate, and to pay all funeral expenses, together with all of my just debts, out of the first money which may come into his hands belonging to my estate.

2nd. I give and devise and bequeath to my son, Tresevant Robinson, the tract of land on which I now live, containing about thirty six acres, also all my other property of whatsoever nature, be it, real or personal.

3rd. I hereby constitute and appoint my son Tresevant, my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
