

I, Edward M. Ferry of the County of Gaston and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form as follows.

First I give my sister Susan Ferry Thirty five Acres of Land to be taken from the South West end of my Plantation including the House that Eliza Biggar now lives in, to have and hold her Natural life.

Second I give my beloved Wife Nancy J. Ferry all of my personal property to have and to hold and dispose of as she may see fit.

Third I give and devise to my wife Nancy J. Berry all the remainder of my lands to have and to hold during her Natural life except so much thereof as may be necessary to pay all my just debts, which said part thereof I will and allow my said Wife Nancy J. Berry to sell at either public or private Sale as she may see fit and make a good and sufficient title on fee simple thereof.

Fourth I will and allow that should my sister Susan die before my wife the said part of my land Willed to her shall go to my wife during her Natural life, and should

know that should my sister Susan die before  
go to my wife during her natural life. And should  
my wife die before my sister Susan then I will and  
allow that all my then remaining land shall be  
equally divided between my sister Susan Berry and  
Sarah. S. Wortman to have and to hold during their  
natural life. Provided the said Sarah Wortman be a single  
woman at said time.

Fifth

After the death of the above named parties I will and  
allow that all of my then remaining lands to be divided  
between my next of kin as the law directs.

Sixth

I do hereby constitute and appoint my my beloved wife  
Nancy J. Berry my lawful executrix to execute this  
my last will and testament according to the true  
meaning and intent thereof.

of full age to execute a Will and was not under any restraint  
to the knowledge, information or belief of this deponent.

It is therefore considered by the court, that the said paper  
writing, and every part thereof is the last Will and Testament  
of the said Edwin Mc Jerry. And the same is ordered to be recorded  
and filed.

And thereupon the said Henry J. Gerry, executor  
as aforesaid duly qualifies as such, by taking and subscribing  
to oath required by law.
