Fourth: It is my will and desire that my executor hereinafter named shall, (in the event that I shall die before my husband) provide him with a home for the term of his natural life, but shall only provide him with the necessary funds which his pension will not provide.

Fifth: I hereby constitute and appoint my beloved son-in-law Samuel B. Huffstetler my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every

Fourth: It is my will and desire that my executor hereinafter named shall, (in the event that I shall die before my husband) provide him with a home for the term of his natural life, but shall only provide him with the necessary funds which his pension will not provide.
