Hoffman the sum of Twenty (\$20.00) dollars to my grand daughter Lizzie Knox I give my narrow bed and bedding and fifty (\$50.00) dollars, to my grand son Oscar Glenn twenty (\$20.00) dollars, to my grand son Robert Glenn twenty (\$20.00) dollars, to my grand son Claude Glenn twenty (\$20.00) dollars, to my grand daughter Essie Russell twenty five (\$25.00) dollars.

It is my will and desire and I do hereby direct that all the rest of my personal effects, including such household and kitchen furniture as is not hereinbefore willed or bequeathed, shall be sold <sup>by</sup> ~~to~~ my said executor hereinafter named and the proceeds divided equally between my said two daughters Minerva J.
