I, Frederick Flume of the aforesaid county and state, being of sound mind, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament:

First: My Executor hereinafter named shall give my body a decent burial, suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives, and pay all funeral expenses, together with all my just debts, out of the first moneys which may come into his hands as my executor, belonging to my estate.

Second- I give and devise to my beloved wife, Annie Flume, all of the real estate of which I may die possessed, on condition however, that she is to only hold the same for her natural life or during her widowhood, and at her death to be equally divided among my six children, Louise Flume Annie Crompton, Tracy Lynn Flume, Mary Smith, Frederick Flume and Lucy Flume, share and share alike, provided that if my wife shall remarry then she shall forfeit all rights hereunder the said property shall immediately go to said children.

Third. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife all my personal property to be used by her during life or widowhood, to be equally divided among said children at her death or when she remarries.

Fourth- I hereby constitute and appoint W. S. Reichel my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this, my last will and testament,

Flume, share and share alike, provided that if my wife shall remarry then she shall forfeit all rights hereunder the said property shall immediately go to said children.

Third. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife all my personal property to be used by her during life or widowhood, to be equally divided among said children at her death or when she remarries.

Fourth- I hereby constitute and appoint W. S. Reichel my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this, my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made.
