First, I give to my Wife all my land lying on the East Side of the Little Shoal Creek, Beginning at a Maple in the Squid Creek and running down the same to Peter Postner line. To have and to hold during the term of her Natural life, And after her death to my son

Phillip, He, Passour. I also give to her all my Household and Kitchen furniture and so much of my life stock as she may like to keep.

I then give to my son Phillip, He, Passour all my land lying on the West Side of the Little Shoal Creek, to have and to hold forever.

And then it is my Will that all the rest of my property be equal divided in four parts. then I give to each of my Children one fourth part. Felix, Anna, Rebecca and Phillip.

And then I Appoint my son Phillip, Executor of this my Will. In Witness whereof I have set my hand and Seal. September
