Item - 1.

Item - 2.

Item - 3.

I give and bequeath to my brother, James A. Nantz Five Hundred Dollars, and one bedstead together with sufficient bedclothing to furnish the same.

Item - 4.

I give and bequeath to my brother David Franklin Nantz Five Hundred Dollars and one bedstead together with sufficient bedclothing to furnish the same.

Item - 5.

I give and bequeath to Girlie Nixon Putnam Five Hundred Dollars.

Item - 6.

I give and bequeath to Berge Elizabeth Putnam Five Hundred Dollars.

Item - 7.

It is my will that if Girlie Nixon Putnam should die before me or before

It is my will that if Gertrude Putman should die before me or before Berge Elizabeth Putman then I give the amount bequeathed in item "5" to Berge Elizabeth Putman, and if Berge Elizabeth Putman should die before me or before Gertrude Nixon Putman then I give the amount bequeathed in item "6" to Gertrude Nixon Putman.

Item ~ 8.

I give to August Abernethy the painting of my husband, August Farley.

Item ~ 9.

All the residue of my estate I give to John A. Nantz, my brother.

Item ~ 10.

I appoint and constitute Brevard Nixon my executor to take charge of my estate and settle the same according to the foregoing provisions of this my last will and testament.
