I, Jonas Jenkins, of aforesaid County and State being of sound mind, do make and declare this my last will and testament:

First, I will that my Executor hereinafter named shall pay my funeral expenses together with any just debts which I may owe at time of my death out of the first moneys coming into his hands belonging to my estate.

Second, I give to my son Sloan Jenkins and his heirs the tract of land which was conveyed to me by deed executed on the 11th day of June, 1892 by Catherine Spencer, D. A. Jenkins and Jane Jenkins his wife, Adjoining lands of Franklin Holland, D. A. Jenkins and J. L. Jenkins and known as the Harrison Jenkins lands: This devisee is subject however to the dower rights of my wife Katy Jenkins as provided by law.

Third, I will that my executor shall settle and distribute such part of my estate as is not heretofore mentioned or bequeathed in the manner provided by law for distribution and settlement of estate of intestate.

Fourth, I hereby constitute and appoint my son Jonas G. Jenkins my lawful executor to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same, hereby revoking and declaring void all other will and testaments by me heretofore made:
