Item 4. I give and bequeath to my son Joseph W. Riddle the sum of twenty five (25) dollars in cash to be paid out of any money or personal property on hands at the time of my death, and in case there should not be sufficient money or personal property to pay said sum of twenty five (25) dollars, then the same shall be a charge upon all the land of which I die seized and possessed, but the said claim shall not be collected

Item 5. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Dora Riddle all money, stock, provisions and personal property of every description owned by me at my death, except so mun thereof as shall be necessary to pay my funeral expenses, just debts, and the legacy mentioned in item 4 of this instrument.

Item 6. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Dora Riddle all the land of which I may die seized and possessed for the term of her natural life, provided she does not again marry, at her death, or in the event of her again marrying, then it is my will and I hereby direct my Executor hereinafter named to sell said land by public auction or private sale as he shall deem best, and that the proceeds be equally divided among my son Joseph W. Riddle, the two children of my wife, Dora Widdle by a former marriage, viz: Annie Wilson and Seth Wilson and any child or children that may hereafter be born to me and my said wife Dora Riddle.

ITem 7. I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Rufus B. Wilson, of Gastonia, Gaston County, N.C. my lawful Executor to execute this my last will and testament and every part thereof according to the true intent and meaning thereof.
