

Wash Will and Testament of Joseph M. Bradley

I Joseph M. Bradley of Gaston County, State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say:

First

That my executor, hereinafter named, shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relatives and friends, and pay all my just debts, however and to whomsoever owing out of the monies that may first come into his hands as part and parcel of my estate.

Second

For and in consideration of my daughter Caroline Hanna and her husband, F. S. Hanna, who lived with me since the year 1870 to November 1879, they having waited on me in such matters as cooking, washing and such other acts common as due from children to parents, I give and bequeath unto my said daughter, Caroline Hanna, and the heirs of her body, one acre and a half Acres of Land including the Dwelling House, beginning on the North side of the Charlotte and Atlanta Air Line Rail Road, beginning at the track of said Rail Road, subject to its right of way and run North 24 poles, thence East 10 poles, thence South 24 poles to the track of said Rail Road, subject to its right of way, thence East 10 poles with the track of said Rail Road

at the Trach of said Rail Road. Subject to its right of Way  
and run North 24 Poles. Thence East 10 Poles. Thence South  
24 Poles to the track of said Rail Road. <sup>Subject to its right of way, then West 10 Poles with the track of said RR.</sup> Said Land to be  
laid off in such Manner that the dwelling House shall be  
the same distance from the East and West lines.

Third

I Will and bequeath to my three Sons Caleb Gradley,  
Benjamin G. Gradley and Francis A. Gradley, and my  
two Daughters Elmira Noland, and Harriett Hanna,  
all the balance of my Real Estate to be sold at Public  
Sale and the proceeds to be equally divided between the  
above named three Sons and two Daughters. To wit  
Elmira Noland & Harriett Hanna, except twenty five  
dollars to be deducted of Harriett Hannas part of  
the land proceeds for a bed & bedding, hereinafter  
willed to her. Which bed is the same that she now  
has with her at home.

Fourth

I Will and bequeath to my three Sons Caleb Gradley,  
Benjamin Gradley and Francis A. Gradley, and my two  
Daughters Elmira Noland & Harriett Hanna, all the balance  
of my personal property, Grain, Money, Notes, except a note  
on F. S. Hanna for One hundred Dollars and the interest  
thereon &c to be equally divided between them.
