In the Name of God Amen.

I, Lyda Warlick of the State of North Carolina, Gaston Co.,
being of sound mind and memory and knowing that it is Appointed
that all persons must die, do make and declare this my last
Will and Testament in the following words.

First, I give up my soul to God who gave it to me and my
body to be buried in a Christian manner,

I, Will and bequeath unto my daughter Lyda Warlick, Seventy
Acres of Land where I now reside, of the South side of said tract.
I also Will and bequeath unto Said Lyda Warlick, all the grain,
on hand, all the growing Crops, and all the Hay, Fodder,

Oates, Schmacks and Straw. Also Cattle, Hogs, Sheep, my Waggon
and all my Farming Tools and all my Household and Kitchen Furniture.

I further more Will and bequeath unto my Daughter Jane Kiefer and to
thine heirs of her body Thirty Acres of Land adjoining Lyda Warlick's
lot running across the Big branch so as to give both water on
theire lots.

I further more Will and bequeath unto R. S. Simpson Thirty acres of
Land adjoining Jane Kiefer's lot, running across the Big branch
by said R. S. Simpson paying the Three Stump Heires Forty $\frac{1}{2}$ Dollars.

The same to be equally divided between said Heires.

I further more Will and bequeath unto A. S. Simpson Thirty acres of
Land, running across the Big branch,

I further more will and bequeath unto R.S. Simpson Thirty acres of
Land adjoining Jane Keefers Lot, running across the Big branch
by said R.S. Simpson paying the Three Stump heirs Forty $\frac{1}{2}$ dollars.
The same to be equally divided between said heirs.

I further more will and bequeath unto A.S. Simpson Thirty acres of
Land adjoining R.S. Simpson's Lot running across the Big branch,
by said A.S. Simpson paying John F. Simpson Forty $\frac{1}{2}$ dollars.

I further more will and bequeath unto John F. Simpson One Small Mule.

I further more will and bequeath unto R.S. Simpson One Gray Horse.

I further more will and bequeath unto R.S. Simpson the balance of my Real Estate,

I further more will and bequeath unto R.S. Simpson Thirty $\frac{1}{2}$ dollars,

by him paying as follows. $\frac{1}{2}$ of Warwick Thirty $\frac{1}{2}$ dollars
Simpson One $\frac{1}{2}$ dollar, the Two Hores Heires Twenty $\frac{1}{2}$ dollars

Stock, Saloma Hores and Sarah Jane Keefner. Now,

By said R.S. Simpson leaving a Cart way throu to the Cart
way to the lower end of the plantation. Also by paying Sarah
Reynolds Thirty $\frac{1}{2}$ dollars.

I do hereby declare this my Last Will and Testamant.

I do hereby revoke all other Wills made by me.

I do hereby appoint Drury & Warwick and Simpson Warwick
my Executors of this Will.
