

I Henry C. White of the County of Gaston & State
of North Carolina, being of sound mind & memory
but considering the uncertainty of my earthly
existence and being also in bad health, yet blessed
be God, do make and declare this my last will
& Testament in manner and form following,
that is to say;

First— That my executor hereinafter named
shall provide for my body a decent burial
suitable to the wishes of my relations & friends
and pay all funeral expenses together with my
just debts, howsoever, to whomsoever owing, out
of the money that may first come into his hands,
as a part or parcel of my estate.

Item 1st,

I give and devise to my son Robert A White
all my land, except the wood-land, lying on the
North side of the Mill Creek, on condition that he
shall pay to my son J H White the sum of forty
dollars cash and that my daughter Hannah C
White shall have her support from the land
and the right to the use of the old end of the house

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all my land, except the wood-land, lying on the
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dollars cash and that my daughter Hannah G
White shall have her support from the land
and the right to the use of the old end of the house
as long as she shall remain single, I also give
to said Robert A White, my horse Dave, to remain
on the place, my interest in the Thrasher, corn-
shells, all the farming tools, kitchen furniture
one bed & bedstead and coverings.

Time 2nd,

I give and devise to my daughter Mary Adela Harris the wood-land lying on the north side of the mill creek, one bed & bedstead with covering, one chest, one spinning-wheel & cards, one flat iron.

Time 3rd,

I give and devise to my daughter Harriette & white her claim of household property, her claim of cattle, walnut cupboard, loom, walnut chairs, one table, one flat iron, one buggy, all the money and notes on hand, one wash pot. She shall also have the use and rights to the old end of the house while she remains single.

Time 4th,

I give and devise to my son Thomas H. white one bed & bedstead & covering & one bureau.

Time 5th,

I will that all other articles of property and my claim of cattle be equally divided, or sold

my claim of said
and the money to be equally divided among all,
that is to say: R A White, Mary Helen Davis,
Hannah G White and Thomas H White.

And lastly I do hereby constitute and
appoint my trusty friend Jacob Kiser my
lawful executor, to all intents and purposes,
to execute this my last will and testament,
according to the true intent & meaning of the
same and every part thereof, hereby revoking
and declaring utterly void all other wills &
testaments said to have been by me made.
