I further Will that he shall not receive said money until twelve months after the execution of this Will, and I will devise to my daughter Sophia S. Beatty at my said wife's death all of the balance of my estate both real and personal to have and to hold forever, and the absolute right to the use of said property as she desires.

Thirdly. I nominate and appoint David J. Glenn Jr. as the Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
