personal Estate. I further Will that he shall not receive said  
money until twelve months after the execution of this Will.  
And I Will and devise to my daughter Sophia S. Beatty at  
my said Wife's death all of the balance of my Estate both real  
and personal to have and to hold forever, and the absolute right  
to dispose of said property as she desires.

Thirdly, I nominate and appoint David J. Glenn, Jr. as  
the Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
