I also give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Hanclson, one moiety

Item third, I give and devise unto my daughter Elizabeth Henry, one tract of land lying at the head of Mansons Branch, containing eleven acres more or less,

I devise unto my two daughters, Rebecca, and Liz. Harrison, fifty acres of land a piece,

I give and devise unto my two sons, Sadock S. Harrison, and Daniel M. Harrison, one hundred and fifty three acres of land of the plantation where I now live to be divided as they may see proper,

I also give and devise unto my five sons and daughters, J. S. Harrison, John Harrison, William C. Harrison, William A. Harrison, Wado M. Harrison, and Margaret Harrison, one dollar each to be paid by my executor hereinafter named,

It is our third of the plantation which I give and devise unto my daughter, Elizabeth Henry, one tract of land lying at the head of Mansons Branch, containing eleven acres more or less,

and Daniel M. Hanson, as I have laid off in lots one hundred for my two named daughters, Rebecca M. Hanson, and S. L. Hanson, and one hundred and fifty three to my two sons named Sadoen S. Hanson, and Daniel M. Hanson, which includes all my plantations which I now live on.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my two sons Sadoen S. Hanson, and Daniel M. Hanson, my lawful executors, to all intents and purposes to execute my last will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of every part and clause thereof, hereby revoking and annulling utterly void all other wills and Testaments, by me heretofore made, I do witness whereof I the said Wm. Hanson, do hereunto set my hand and seal, this the twenty-fifth day of Sept. 1876.
