I, William W. OrrEnder, of the aforesaid county and State, being of sound mind and memory, but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make, publish and declare this to be my last will and testament, viz:

First. I give, devise and bequeath to my daughter, Frances Orrender, Seven hundred (\$700.00) dollars in cash.

Second. I give, devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Margaret Orrender, all the balance of my estate both real and personal upon condition that she pay for a monument to my grave, and all other funeral expenses, together with all my just debts to whomsoever due.

THird. It is my will and desire that my brother, C.B. Orrender, be and I hereby constitute and appoint him Guardian for my said daughter, Frances Orrender, to have and to hold the custody of the amount (\$700~~0~~.00) willed to her in the first item of this will; to keep the same at interest and to pay out the interest only for her education: no part of the principal shall be paid out for any purpose until she arrives at the age of twenty one years. In case of the death of my said daughter said \$700.00 shall go to my wife Margaret Orrender.

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Fourth. I hereby constitute and appoint my brother, C.B.Orrender, my lawful executor to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof.

In Witness Whereof, I, the said William W.Orrender, do hereby set my hand and seal, this the 18 day of October, 1905.
