To Have and To Hold the same to be Held & Yielding & Paying the provided Rent dated the ninth of June one thousand six hundred & Sixty six.

Hiles Laundry To all &c Whom the now know ye That the said Sir William Berkeley

150 Acres Knight Governor & give and grant unto Hiles Laundry one hundred & fifty Acres of Land in the County of Northampton at the seaboard side bounding Eastward by the sea Northwestward by a line of market trees running from a point at Chappy Point West three hundred poles to a corner tree marked thence South Seventy five poles for the Westward bounds to a second corner tree marked and thence East to the sea for the Southern bounds. The said Land being formerly granted to John Stearns son to William Manning deceased and lately found to belong to his Majesty as by an Inquisition recorded in the Secretaries Office under the hands and seals of the Justly Sworn before him John Springer.
