To all whosoever now know or shall know that I, Francis Lord Howard Esq. do with the Advice and Consent of the Council of State accordingly give and grant unto John Morden four hundred thirty eight acres of land lying in the Woods between the Southward & Eastern Branches of the River in the County of London. Beginning at a stake near a white oak, a Corner tree of Henry Glenny Butte and Morden East two hundred forty two poles to two Lime trees growing together in a Pocotone of the Green Sea, then again from the stake and running upon the north side of Thomas Butte North of East four poles to a Lime tree Corner tree, thence North West forty eight poles to a Oak tree near the Green Sea, then North East two hundred & eighty poles to a Lime tree, then East forty five poles to a Lime tree, then North West thirty five poles to a Lime tree, then East two hundred and ten poles to a Lime tree, then South East two hundred eighty five poles to a Quaker in the Green Sea, then South running of the Camp forty poles further thence bounding on the Green Sea to the end of the first East Line to the two Limes. Two hundred & fifty acres of which land was granted unto Barron Geoffrey and Anne Deringham by Patent dated the 25th of October 1673, and by them assigned to the John Morden, and the Remainder of the Land being due of and for the redemption of five pence into this Colony, whose names are in the Records mentioned under this Patent. To Have and to Hold to the said John Morden his heirs and assigns forever. Provided he should this Christmas day of October Anno Domini 1686.

To all whosoever now know or shall know that I, Francis Lord Howard Esq. do with the Advice and Consent of the Council of State accordingly give and grant unto John Armistead and Mr John Gwin two hundred and two acres & a half of land, lying in Kingston parish in the County of Kent, Beginning at a small marble pine standing on the Eastward side of a Branch near a Chappell, and in a line of marble trees belonging to an old Divident of land formerly taken up by John Hugh Gwin Esq. and sold by the said Gwin to Mr William Armistead Esq. and from thence running South South West thirty poles to a Corner white oak standing in a line of marble trees belonging to the land of Mr William Elliott Esq. thence along the said Elliotts land, and the land of Thomas Allamain East South East three hundred and fifty poles to the land of John Armistead, thence North North East thirty poles along the land of the said Armistead to Gwin Dams, and over the said Dams to a point of land, thence West North West three hundred and fifty poles to the place first specified. The said land being due of and for the redemption of five pence into this Colony, whose names are in the Records mentioned under this Patent. To Have and to Hold to the said John Armistead and John Gwin their heirs and assigns forever. Provided he should this Christmas day of October Anno Domini 1686.
