To all & wheresoever know ye that I y^e Francis Lord Howard Geo^r doe
with y^e Advice and Consent of y^e Council of State accordingly give and Grant
unto John Bruden four hundred and fifty eight acres of land lying in y^e Woods
between y^e Southwold & Eastern Branches of Eliz^e River in y^e County of
Suffolk, Beginning att a Stake under a white Oak, a corner tree of Henry
Butt and Mardon East two hundred forty six poles to two lines being
growing together in a Pecosse of y^e green sea, then running from y^e said Stake
and running upon y^e north side of Henry Butt North of Park four rods
to a Point his corner tree, then North West forty eight poles to a red Oak
near y^e Green sea, then North East two hundred and eighty poles to a small tree
to a Point, then East forty six poles to a Line, then North North East thirty five
poles to a Line, then North North West forty two poles to a Line, then North, passing
y^e pole to a Line, then East two hundred and one poles to a Line, then
South East one hundred eighty four poles to a Corner in y^e Green sea, then
continuing of y^e said fourty poles further, then bounding on y^e Green
sea to y^e end of y^e first said Line to y^e two Points. Two hundred and fifty
Acres of y^e land was granted unto Sir John Grey and Isaac Dennington
of Lattant dated y^e 25th of Octo^r 1633, and by them assigned to y^e John
Bruden, and of Remainer of y^e Land being due y^e for y^e Transportation
of five tons into this Country, whose names are in y^e Record mentioned

nturies and two acres of a half of land, lying in Kingston parish
in Suff^y County, Beginning att a small white pine standing on y^e
Eastward side of a Branch under a Chappel, and in a line of made
trees belonging to an old Tenant of land formerly taken up of Cate
John Green Esq^r, Hugh Green Ditt, and sold by y^e to Mr. William Elliott son
and from thence running South South West thirty poles to a corner tree
Oak standing in a line of marked trees belonging to y^e land of Mr.
William Elliott son^r there along y^e Elliotts land, and y^e land of Hugh
Allamain East South East three hundred and forty poles to y^e land of
Cate John Armstrong, then North North East twenty poles along the
land of y^e said Armstrong to y^e Green Ditt, and over y^e said Ditt to a
point of land, then North North East, three hundred and forty poles
to y^e place first specified. This y^e land being due y^e for y^e Transportation
of five tons into this Country, whose names are in y^e Record mentioned
