 calledellis after his mothers deceased to him & to his heirs for ever. It. 13. I give to my three
 sons Richard David & Tho: & to my three daughters Grace Margaret & Mary & y^e child which
 my wife now goes with three heifers of three years old & three ewes to each child to be
 lived to them at y^e day of marriage or when they come to age. It. 14. I give to my daughter
 Grace one feather bed & furniture to be delivered her at y^e day of her marriage. It. 15.
 I give to my son John Scott three heifers of three years old & three ewes to be delivered to
 him when he comes to age in full of his portion. It. 16. I give to my loving wife all
 my goods chattels & Estate except what I have already given to her during her na-
 tural life & after her deceased to be equally divided betwixt all my children that
 shall be then living. I do appoint my loving wife Faith Scott & my Love-
 ing brother Thomas Scott Executors of this my last will & Testament In witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twelfth day of January
 in the year of our Lord 1726.

 in body but sound & firm in memory do Ordain this my last will & Testament in
 manner as followeth. I give to my two sons John Whitehurst & Hugh Whitehurst
 part of y^e lands lying at the three ar uns to be equally divided betwixt them & their
 heirs for ever. also I give unto my son Hugh y^e land that was formerly

104 William Rogers to him this heirs for ever. also I do give unto my son John the
 plantation which I now live on to him this heirs for ever after if I decease of my wife
 and if said John live to be at the age of sixteen then to have half of plantation and
 the other half to be in my house and the Chamber about stairs to both the children
 to him. also I do give to my four children three mares now running in woods to run
 for their good till they come at age & then to be equally divided to my sons that my sons
 that be at age at sixteen also I do give to my two sons each of them a gun. in length
 to Hugh & John to John. also I do give to my four children when they come at age
 to be delivered them three Cowes a piece to my two sons each of them one Iron pot also
 I do give my four children each of them two Cows when they come at age & I do give to
 my two Daughters each of them a feather bed & covering & bolster to each of my sons
 a Chisel & my son John my sword & Carbine bolts & my will is that if if man or woman
 given to increase to a house on a piece then to be sold by if of poor or low buying be-
 ing for my sons. also I do give my two sons each of them two breeding cows when they
 come to age also my will is that my negro Paul should be my wife's during her life
 if said negro live longer then to be my daughter Elizabeth's if please God that
 she live then to be divided between my children that desiring: moreover I do give
 all & most of my movable estate within & without after my death to be paid to my wife
 Mary Whitehurst with all I owe that are due to me from any person or persons of
 my sole Executor of this my last will & Testament in Confirmation of & witness
