The above assignment hath relation to & was endorsed on a patent of
2^d two hundred & twenty eight acres of land granted to Thomas Franklin
and dated the twenty fifth day of Octob. 1691, and the one half thereof being
one hundred & fourteen acres sold & assigned by the 3^d Franklins unto
James Fitzgerald by an assignment upon the 3^d patent & recorded the 2.
Mo. 1692.

In the name of God amen I. Jno. Woodhouse of Princess Anne County
& Virga, being weak & sick in body but sound in mind & memory & knowing
the frailty & uncertainty of this present life do make, constitute, ordaine
& appoint this my last will & testament in manner & form following, hereby
revoking & disannulling all former will or wills, testaments or testaments made
or intended to be made, either by word or writing. Impst. I give &
bequeath my soul to God my creator, who gave it me, hoping that
through the merits & righteousness of Jesus Christ my saviour, I shall
obtain the remission & pardon of all my sins & be made partaker of
everlasting life in the kingdom of Heaven: And my body to the earth
from whence it was taken to be buried at the discretion of my executors
hereafter named, in hopes of a blessed & joyful resurrection. As to
my worldly estate I give & bequeath to my eldest son Jno. Wood-

daughter Ruth Bulcher the plantacion she now dwelleth upon & the other half of the land of that patent & to her heires of her body lawfully begotten & if she should die without such heire then to return to my surviving heire, alsoe I give & bequeath to her my said daughter one young beast to be delivered to her immediately after my decease; -
I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary Woodhouse a plantacion in the fresh ponds called the Island and to her heires forever, alsoe I give & bequeath to her one silver spoon, one feather bed, bolster & rug, one pewter dish, one Iron pot, one cow & calf & one young gray horse which I gave her formerly, & the afore mentioned Legatyses to be delivered to her at her day of marriage; -

to purchase negroes, and that what agroes whether of those or
most or those I shall have neede of for my self & dependents
