at my house also one large iron bound chest of one iron pot to
him & to his heirs and assigns forever.

Thirdly I give and devise to Leah Daughtie one Cow & calf to her & to her
heirs and assigns forever —

Fourthly I give and devise to my nephew William Daughtie senior all the

him & to his heirs and assigns forever.

Thirdly I give and devise to Leah Daughter one Cows calf to her & to her heirs and assigns forever.

Fourthly I give and devise to my nephew William (Daughter) senior all the rest and residue of my estate both real and personal consisting one negro man named Jacob, & also my household furniture of every kind all my plantation utensils, my stock & any other thing that is not already disposed of to him and to his heirs and assigns forever.

Fifthly I nominate and appoint my nephew William (Daughter) senior to be my executor to this my last will and testament, hereby desiring him to fulfill the same.
