all my negroes & stock of all kinds & all my estate both of what nature or
kind whatever during her natural life & then as follows.

Item I leave to my daughter Elizabeth Breezy the use of my negroes
namely Susannah & Rachel during her life & at her death the said negroes to be
divided between her son William Breezy & his two sons daughters & grand

& Penny Breezy to them & their heirs & assigns. Also I leave her one quarter her share
in the plantation where I now live also one hundred acres land
lying on each side of a crystal long branch that I bought of John Rice also
fifty acres land joining it that I bought of Isaac Hunter as the
deed will show I give to him & his heirs and assigns forever.
I give to my grandson William Breezy two hundred acres land that I
bought of Mary Scott & Judith Jones daughters of James Jones dec'd also
two hundred & fifty six acres that I bought of Moses Measels as the deed
will show also one negro boy named Ben to him & his heirs and assigns forever.
I give to my granddaughter Mary Breezy one negro woman named
Ranner & one negro woman named Bager to her & her heirs and assigns
I give to my granddaughter Nancy Breezy one negro fellow named Coffey
& one negro girl named Anne & the bed & furniture to her & her heirs and assigns
I give to my granddaughter Elizabeth Breezy one negro man named
Coyor & fifty dollars to her and her heirs & assigns. I give to my gran-
daughter Judith Breezy one negro girl named Penny & her increase & fifty
dollars to her and her heirs and assigns. I give to my granddaugh-
-ter Sarah Breezy one negro girl named Rose & her increase & fifty

For Sarah Creecy one negro girl named Rose & her increase and feather bed
& furniture & fifty dollars to her & her heirs & assigns. Item I give to my
granddaughter Emily Creecy one negro man Charles & one negro boy named Little
Joe to her & her heirs and assigns. Item I give to my daughter Agnes Creecy one
negro boy named Peter & fifty dollars. To her and her heirs & assigns. Item I
give to my granddaughter Princy Creecy one negro boy named Jack & fifty
dollars to her and her heirs & assigns. Item I leave all the rest of my estate now
already given to be equally divided between my daughter Elizabeth Creecy
& all my grandchildren share & share alike say to them and their heirs and assigns
Lastly I nominate & appoint my friends William Creecy James Barnes & Sam-
uel Hamrell executors to this my last will & testament to see the same performed
according to the true intent & meaning in witness whereof I have hereunto
