Being now sick and weak in body but of perfect mind & memory thanks be given to the allmighty God for he came to make and ordain this to be my last will and testament in manner & form following that is to say. First of all I give and bequeath to my beloved son David Outlaw the plantation and dements & improvements whereof I now live with all the rest of my land in the old town meek to him his heirs forever if lawfull begeten & if David Outlaw shall dy without care then to Brother George Outlaw to him and his heirs forever I give to my son David Outlaw negro Charles, Lucy and all my negroes with all my stock cattle hags and sheep and all my household furniture if my son shall dy without care Lawfull begeten to my brothers & sister children to them and then care over I give to my son David Outlaw if he shall dy without care then to my brother George Outlaw to him & his heirs forever I constitute make and ~~make~~ ~~and~~ ordain this my last will and testament by him freely to be proved and enjoyed and thereby utterly disallow and engaged and every other will legacies and executors by me named with no nominate and favor my friends Seth Rowntree George Outlaw and Isaac Roosten to be my sole executors in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this first day of February in the year of our Lord 1791

To them and their heirs ever I give to my son Davis Oullaw ^{my wife's children} of the whole
of my without care then to my brother George Oullaw to him & his heirs forever
I constitute make and ~~make~~ ~~and~~ ordain this my last will and testament
by him freely to be proved and enjoyed and there by utterly disallow
and enjoyed and every other will legacies and executors by one named Will
I do nominate and point my friends Seth Rowntree George Oullaw and
Isaac Leosten to be my sole executors in witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this first day of February in the year of our
Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety six
