son Daniel Taylor twenty five silver dollars. Also I give to my son
John Elizabeth Moore two silver dollars. Also I give & bequeath to my son
Ruben the plantation where I now live & one feather bed & bedding
trunk. Also give to my daughter Freney one bed & furniture one dress
& one woman saddle. Also give to her two sets fine shilling
and all the remainder part of my property I desire that it shall
be equally divided between Nolley Taylor, Jose & Samuel & Elizabeth
Moore & Ruben & Freney. I do nominate and appoint Benjamin
Bennett Jose Taylor to be my sole executors of this my last
will & testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made in
that of which I have hitherto set my hand and seal this fifteen
day of February 1803 — Sign & seal & published & delivered by me
