ed almighty God to bestow on me in this transitory world I Dispose of it in manner  
and form following, Imprimis

I Item, I Give and Bequeath unto my Dear and loving wife fifty head of  
hogs Seventeen head of cattle Two head of horses One feather bed & furniture  
and all my other Goods and Chattels Lands or tenements that I have or enjoy  
to her, at her pleasure of Disposall, And I do appoint my truly loving wife with  
my two loving friends John Badgett of the above county and William  
Badgett of Orange County of the above province, whom I constitute and Ordain  
to be joint Executors to this my last will and testament utterly revoking and  
making Void all former will or wills by me made ratifying and confirming this  
and as other to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto  
Set my hand and Affix, my Seal this twenty, Sixth day of October One thousand  
Seven hundred and Sixty Seven
